
Rising 6th Grade Required Reading

Patterson, James. Maximum Ride: The Angel Experiment.


Riordan, Rick. The Lightning Thief.


Tolan, Stephanie. Surviving the Applewhites.




Rising 5th Grade Required Reading

Northrop, Michael. Plunked.


Patterson, James, and Chris Tebbetts. *Middle School: The Worst Years of My Life*.

To use the Capstone ebook library, students should:

- a. Click My Capstone Library and then click "Login"
- b. Username = capstonesummer / Password = interactive 19 (no caps, no spaces)
- c. Start reading! (no downloads necessary)

FREE access to NEWSELA Summer Reading Challenge

To read articles in the Newsela summer reading collection, students should join the appropriate class:

- a. Click <u>Rising 5th Grade Class</u>, <u>Rising 6th Grade Class</u>, or <u>Rising 7th Grade</u> Class
- b. Click "I have a Newsela account", and then sign in with Google (make sure you are using your ltps.info account)
- c. At the top of the screen, look for Collections. Click to see the Summer Reading Challenge 2019 collections.
