Follow the news! (Summative Grade)

- Choose four weeks during the summer and read one newspaper and one periodical article per week beginning the week of June 20.
 - (total 8 articles -2 per week)*
 - The purpose of the two different types of articles is that a newspaper article is generally less in depth, and focuses on the "new" news. Periodicals (magazines) spend more time researching and publishing, as they are weekly or monthly.
- After reflecting on each reading, write a two-paragraph journal entry in which you comment on both the political/constitutional ideology as presented in each piece as well as the implications of the issue for the future of the United States.
